I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 82190, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Samuel Jordan was enrolled on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of Sept., 1861, at Camp Dennison in Co. B, 34<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a private on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of Sept. 1861, at Camp Dennison, in Co. "B", 34<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. B of that Regiment, for the months of Sept. and Oct., 1864, he is reported "Sgt. Missing in action at Fisher Hill Va. Sept 22<sup>d</sup> /64" Dropped from subsequent rolls. No evidence of death on file.
