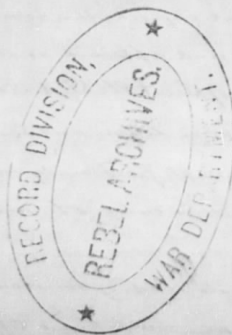

Report of the Second Auditor on the several claims of Major Birdin Deskin for forty dollars, Captain Balaam W. Higginbotham for thirty dollars and thirty one cents, Captain Ebenezer Brewster for thirty dollars and thirty one cents, Captain W. S. Galaspie for thirty four dollars and sixty six cents, and Second Lieut Eli Steel, for services in the 188 Regiment Virginia Militia

The claim of Major Birdin Deskin is for 8 days service, he charges forty dollars - It should be 7 days, and thirty four dollars, this account is certified to by H. S. Bowen Col 188 Regiment Virginia, and approved by H. Marshall Brig. Genl.; a receipt at the foot of the account, acknowledges the payment of the said sum by Major J. F. Fisher; year of service not stated. The claims of Captain Balaam W. Higginbotham and Captain Ebenezer Brewster are for 7 days service each; and they severally charge thirty dollars and thirty one cents, certified and approved as in the foregoing statement; year of service not stated.

The claim of Captain W. S. Galaspie is for 8 days service, he charges thirty four dollars and ~~16~~⁶⁶/₁₀₀ cents; It should be 7 days, ~~when is an error~~ as to the amount charged, this service is charged in the year 1862; it is certified to and approved as stated above.

The claim of Lieut Eli Steel is for 7 days service in the year 1862, he charges Eighteen dollars and sixty two cents, and gives to Major J. F. Fisher a receipt for Twenty one dollars ²²/₁₀₀ in full of said account; the said account is certified to and approved in like manner as the foregoing accounts.

From this statement of the several claims, there is no evidence, that the claimants were commissioned Officers in the Regiment aforesaid; nor is there any evidence that they were regularly mustered in the service of the Confederate States;

Brig General Marshall had no power to call into service, any portion of the Militia of the State.

There is no law of the Congress of the Confederate States vesting this Department with authority, to allow claims of this character.
