

LOCAL MATTERS.

Death of Colonel Nathan T. Dushane.—The many friends of Colonel N. T. Dushane were startled yesterday by the announcement of his death. The colonel was the commanding officer of the First Maryland Veteran Regiment. He met his death on Sunday morning last, during an assault of the rebels on Major General Warren's corps, who were holding the Weldon railroad. Col. D. was acting brigadier general of the Maryland brigade in Major General Warren's command, and is said to have been gallantly leading his men in battle when he fell mortally wounded. The deceased was an active member and past grand of Franklin Lodge, No. 2, Independent Order of Odd-Fellows, a past grand master of the Grand Lodge of Maryland, and for some time filled the important position of treasurer of the Grand Lodge.

Mr. Joseph B. Escavaille, the Secretary of the grand Lodge, yesterday received a telegraphic dispatch to the effect that the remains of Col. Dushane would reach this city this morning. He leaves a wife and interesting family to mourn his death, and large numbers of personal friends to revere his memory. He was during one term a member of the Legislature, and for many years held the position of commissioner for opening streets, but on the breaking out of the war he was among the first to rally to the support of the government, and was in many hard fought battles, always behaving with coolness and bravery.
