O., dated July 11, 1864, the cavalry companies were directed to be designated the 9th Regiment Georgia Cavalry, but these companies appear to have continued to serve as a part of Cobb's Legion without change of designation.

State of Georgia } On this the 2nd day of December 1862
Newton County } personally appeared before me the undersigned
a Justice of the peace in & for said
County Stephen Mayfield who after being duly sworn
deposes and says that he is the father of W. N. Mayfield
deceased who was a Corporal in Captain Lusk's Company
of the 1st Georgia Volunteer Infantry attached
by General Thomas W. H. to the service of the Con-
federate States in the present war with the United
States, that the said W. N. Mayfield entered the service at
Decatur in the County of DeKalb and State aforesaid on or
about the 1st day of July 1861 and died of wounds received in
battle on or about the 13th day of October 1862. Claiming
no other wife child or descendant of child surviving him
that he makes this deposition for the purpose of obtaining from
the Government of the Confederate States whatever may be
due the said W. N. Mayfield at the time of his death for pay
bounty or other allowances for his services as Corporal aforesaid.
Sworn to & subscribed before me

And on the same day & year aforesaid also appeared before me a Justice
of the peace as aforesaid Newton Anderson who is well known
to me & whom I hereby certify to be a person of veracity & credibility also
having been duly sworn says on oath that he is well acquainted with
Stephen Mayfield the claimant & also knew W. N. Mayfield deceased
until just before his death the soldier herein mentioned & that the statement
made under oath by said Stephen Mayfield the claimant as to his
relationship to the deceased soldier is true & correct in every particular
to the best of his knowledge & belief & that in the said Newton Anderson
is a fully constituted & sworn to & subscribed before me
David Thompson J.P. Newton Anderson

State of Georgia, I know all men by their presents that I Stephen
Norton County, Mayfield of said County State being the
father of W^m Mayfield deceased who died from
wounds received in the service of the Confederate States on or
about the 13th day of October 1862 do make constitute and appoint

all money goods or chattels that may be due me as heir of my son
