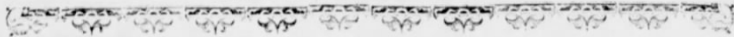

Andrew Johnson

The undersigned John
M. Morrow, a citizen of the County of Wash-
ington and State of Virginia, respectfully re-
presents, that he was a private in the 19th Virginia
regiment, for twelve months, and was after-
wards a Captain in the 6th Tennessee Regiment for
two years; and was in no other capacity in
the service of the rebel government, during the
recent rebellion.

My Petitioner states that he has been
presented in the Federal Court at Knoxville
Tn, he is now under bond for his appearance
there to answer to charge at the next winter
term of said Court. And for this cause
alone he is excluded from the benefits of
the late Amnesty Proclamation.

My Petitioner states that he has taken the
Omnibus Oath prescribed by the recent procla-
mation of Your Excellency with due in good faith
to observe said Oath to conduct himself as
an orderly quiet loyal citizen of the United
States. Copy of said Oath is herewith enclosed.

Petitioner therefore prays that Your
Excellency will grant him a special pardon
for past offences, and he will very pro-
