

## Civil War Nurse, 93, Dies In Muskegon; Kin Live In Bad Axe

Bad Axe, Feb. 20—News has been received here of the death Sunday in Muskegon, Mich., of Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Osborn, 92, one of the last Civil war nurses in the United States.

Harry Osborn, who is in charge of the federal surplus commodities warehouse here, is a son of Mrs. Osborn. Mrs. Anna Shoemaker, Bad Axe, is her daughter. They left today for Muskegon.

Funeral services and burial for Mrs. Osborn will be held in Muskegon Wednesday.

Born in Pontiac Sept. 10, 1847, Mrs. Osborn went to Detroit with her parents when she was six weeks old. She was the ward during her childhood of Joseph Campau, famous pioneer statesman of Detroit.

Mrs. Osborn became a nurse in the Union army after the battle of Chickamauga, in which her husband, Robert Bruce Osborn, was wounded. She was called to care for him and other soldiers.

It is believed she was one of the last four Civil war nurses in the United States.

Mrs. Osborn was well known here through frequent visits with her children.
